Principal's Report: Gabe Savage

• Lock-down Drill - Intruder alert drill, the school needs to do it in the first 90 days of school, so you don't have to do a fire drill as well. The Teachers language for the kids is - we use this as practice inside the building, we can use it for a visitor without a name tag, a lost child, etc

- Veteran's Day Proud of the veterans show. The third grade team and other teachers do a great job.
- PBIS Incentives The team is working to come up with additional incentives to reinforce the children's good behavior. There should be more information by January.
- Sleep Study The district plans to video tape these sessions, so people can review them. They are having a panel of three school districts tonight at the School Board Meeting. They will discuss what it looks like in their school. Then allow parents to ask questions. Will not meet again till December because they are working on figuring what the High School Schedules would look like.
- What's happening in the classrooms 2nd grade teachers are doing bar modeling with their students for the first time. In 5th grade the students are bumping up their writing skills to be more like investigative journalist. The best work happens in the classroom from now through March.
